Homily on Divine Mercy and the Memorial of Pope Francis > 27th April, 2025

Today, we come together in prayer and reflection, honoring the great mystery of Divine Mercy and remembering the life of Pope Francis, who, with his deep faith and commitment to Christ, left a profound impact on the Church and the world. His passing is a moment of profound sorrow, but also one of great hope, as we reflect on the themes of mercy, faith, and eternal life.

The Feast of Divine Mercy, instituted by Saint John Paul II, invites us to meditate on God's infinite mercy. This devotion calls us to recognize that no matter how great our sins, God's mercy is greater. It is a mercy that reaches beyond human understanding, a mercy that heals, restores, and transforms.
